

CRITERIA SPECIFIC TO THE PHYSIOTHERAPY AND REHABILITATION PROGRAM

These program criteria are for undergraduate graduates who graduate with the title of "physiotherapist". Despite the different structuring of different universities, "physiotherapy and rehabilitation" training, directly in contact with the patient; Since it trains a health professional who plays a direct role in improving and protecting health; basic medical education, all approaches to the protection and improvement of health, professional-specific evaluations and practices, and current legislation and practices on social health should provide sufficient content, equipment and practical application opportunities. Physiotherapists gather skills and competencies specific to the following measurable discipline:

- The competence to evaluate, define, plan, implement, change and terminate the treatment program required for physiotherapy and rehabilitation,
- The ability to organize and apply physiotherapy and rehabilitation services effectively and adequately,
- Ability to keep records and prepare reports,
- Ability to take an active role in research and project studies
- The ability to contribute to the formation of appropriate health policies to follow the developments in the field of physiotherapy and rehabilitation of the society towards the changing and diversifying needs,
- The ability to work effectively, efficiently and in line with ethical principles with other healthcare professionals and other disciplines they interact with.
